

Call of Technical Papers for SAMRIDDHI-Journal of Physical Sciences, Engineering and Technology (S-JPSET)

Call for Manuscripts:

The Journal is currently accepting original high-quality research manuscripts for publication. The Journal welcomes the submission of manuscripts that meet the scientific criteria of significance and academic excellence. All research articles submitted for the journal will be peer-reviewed within 1-3 months of submission. Following the peer-reviewed acceptance, the accepted & formatted articles will normally be published in the next available issue.

Article Types for Submission:

All submitted formatted full-text articles should report original, previously unpublished research results, experimental or theoretical. Articles submitted to the journal should meet these criteria and must not be under consideration for publication elsewhere. Two types of articles should be submitted to the journal;

- a) *Regular Research Articles:*** These articles should describe new and carefully confirmed findings, and experimental procedures should be given in sufficient detail for others to verify the work. The length of a full text article should be the minimum required to describe and interpret the work clearly (maximum 5000 words).
- b) *Short Research Communications:*** A short communication article is suitable for recording the results of complete small investigations or giving details of new models or hypotheses, innovative methods, techniques or apparatus. The style of main sections need not conform to that of full-length papers. Short communications are 4 to 6 printed pages in length (maximum 1500 words).
- c) *Review Articles:*** A critical review of the state-of-the-art with examples of applications in design and profitable manufacture without extensive analysis limited to maximum 4500 words.

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The Journal will only accept manuscripts submitted through [electronic-mail](#). Electronic submission of manuscripts is strongly encouraged, provided that the text, tables, and figures are included in a single [Microsoft Word file](#) and [Copyright Transfer Form](#) where detailed instructions can be found on preparing manuscripts for submission.

Abstract: The manuscript should contain an abstract. The abstract should be self-contained and citation-free and should not exceed 150 words.

Keywords: Add about four key words or phrases in alphabetical order, separated by commas.

Introduction: This section should be succinct, with no subheadings.

Acknowledgments: All acknowledgments (if any) should be included at the very end of the manuscript before the references and may include supporting grants, presentations, and so forth.

References: Authors are responsible for ensuring that the information in each reference is complete and accurate. All references must be numbered consecutively and citations of references in text should be identified using numbers in square brackets (e.g., “as discussed by Smith [9]”; “as discussed elsewhere [9, 10]”). All references should be cited within the text; otherwise, these references will be automatically removed.

Preparation of Figures: Each figure should be embedded in the electronic manuscript file. All figures should be cited in the manuscript in a consecutive order. Each figure is subject to resizing to fit into the column's width or the full text width for consistency and clarity. The labels of the figures are also subject to resizing to be of minimum 9 pt according to conferences in-house specifications.

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Units of Measurement: Units of measurement should be presented simply and concisely using System International (SI) units. A list of non-standard Abbreviations should be added in the articles. In general, non-standard abbreviations should be used only when the full term is very long and used often. Each abbreviation should be spelled out and introduced in parentheses the first time it is used in the text.

Prospective authors should submit their full text manuscripts using the [electronic mail](#). An acknowledgement for the receipt of the manuscript will be e-mailed to the corresponding author same day or within three days.

The cover letter should include the corresponding author's full address and telephone/fax numbers and should be sent to the Editor, with the file, whose name should begin with the first author's surname, as an attachment. The authors may also suggest two to four reviewers for the manuscript (the journal may designate other reviewers).

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
